

Lightning Talk Guidelines

A Lightning Talk is a 2-3 minute pre-recorded presentation of an author's research. You may also provide a handout to accompany your presentation to illustrate your findings by displaying graphs, photos, diagrams, and a small amount of text.

NPHA Presenter Policy:

- Presenters must be individual members of NPHA to present
- Poster presenters must register for the meeting. Please visit the [conference website](#) for information regarding registration.
- All presenters must be registered by the Early Registration Deadline (August 27, 2021).
- Presenters who fail to show up for their scheduled presentations without previously notifying the program planner of cancellation will not be permitted to present papers or posters at any NPHA-sponsored meeting for two years following the "no-show."

General Information

- For this year's virtual format, lightning talk presenters will record a 2-3 minute video overview of their work along with 3-5 PowerPoint slides outlining the content that would typically be included in a traditional printed poster.
- The pre-recorded videos will be available throughout the conference. A Q&A session will be held during the conference for participants to interact with presenters.
- Presenters will be expected to participate in short training on the technology that will be used for recording your talk.
- A copy of the abstract that you submitted will be included in the conference program. You will have the opportunity to make edits to your abstract. You will receive a link notifying you that the system is open for edits.
